The pupil premium is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. This financial year, schools will receive the following funding for each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years: •£1,320 for primary-aged pupils

- •£2.300 for each Looked After Child
- •£2,300 for each child who has ceased to be looked after because of adoption, a special guardianship order, a child arrangements order or a residence order The government have decided that Head teachers and school leaders can decide how to use the Pupil Premium.

The school has in place an action plan detailing the key actions the school will take to accelerate the progress of PP pupils. We are also closely monitoring how we are spending the allocated funds to ensure they are having an impact on pupil's achievement both academically and socially so no child is left behind.

Progress and attainment of all pupils is carefully tracked and analysed from a rich field of data in order to draw conclusions and develop action plans. We also make use of a wide range of educational research in order to decide how best to spend our funding to maximise the opportunities for our pupils.

Our pupil premium plan is reviewed and updated termly. Our funding priorities fall into the following areas:

- Quality of teaching for all
- Targeted interventions
- •Enrichment within and beyond the curriculum
- •Engagement of parents / carers •Social, Emotional and Mental Health
