We team up again with Alexandra Palace and Haringey Schools Librarians Group for Biblio-buzz, a reading initiative and award that encourages young people aged 9–12 years old to immerse themselves in the world of books.

The challenge is set for young people to read six selected novels, before getting them to vote for their favourite texts. There will be a host of events - but that's not all, anyone taking on the reading challenge will be invited to Alexandra Palace for the Biblio-buzz 2022 awards ceremony on 25 March 2022!

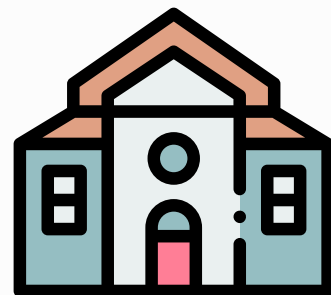

MAKING LIBRARIES BETTER FOR THE FUTURE

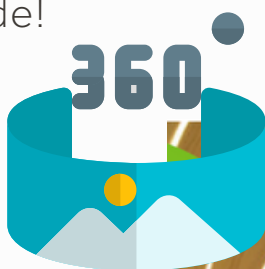


We know how important libraries are to Haringey's communities – so we're improving them to offer you more!

We kicked off by investing in new IT across all libraries to improve digital facilities for users. This includes new public computers and printer, faster internet speeds, interactive self-service terminals and clever tools for smarter stock buying.

[Hornsey Library](#), had a night to remember on its official reopening evening last November by the borough's mayor, Cllr Adam Jogee. Members of Haringey Young Musicians played amazingly ceremony at the library.

The council invested over £3 million in upgrading Hornsey Library, making it bigger, better, more accessible and providing even more services for users. Not only is there an Immersive Space for younger users, there is even a cinema inside!





Coombes Croft Library also reopened in October 2020, looking refreshed with new furniture, increased study space, a wider range of new books and a great new children's area.



We had the reopening of Stroud Green and Harringay Library last December by children's mega-author Michael Rosen, with local residents in their hundreds joining in the celebrations.

Refurbishments included newly installed lift, new meeting rooms alongside essential internal and external maintenance work as well as new furniture and books!

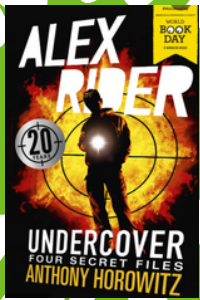


Free Gift to Year 7s
